Mayor Brinkley called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM.

Present: Mayor Carl Brinkley, Vice Mayor Hillert, Councilwoman Roberts, Councilman Irvine, and Councilman Umstead

Also present: Darlene Burcham, Town Manager and LeeAnna Tyler, Finance Director

LeeAnna Tyler passed out the revenue and expenditure summaries for FY16 and noted where revenues are improving.

Town Manager passed out copies of the final Water Agreement which will be placed on the September 27, 2016 agenda for adoption, followed by the Alleghany County Board of Supervisors action on October 4, 2016. Mr. Irvine asked about the number of times the County exceeded the trigger for the second tier rate and the Town Manager agreed to get that information.

The Town Manager mentioned the growing use of Airbnb options, including here in Clifton Forge and asked if Council would consider adopting an ordinance to collect the lodging tax from these establishments. Council indicated a willingness to consider at a future meeting.

At 7:45 PM, Rob Catlin, Lars Lemburg, and Bob Kidd joined the meeting and presented an option agreement to purchase the turntable at the old railyard. The C & O Historical Society wants to apply for VDOT funding of a second phase of track improvement to include moving the turntable, establishing a new concrete pit with drainage, and attaching to some existing track. VDOT funding will not be sufficient to fund the entire project so they are looking at donated materials and perhaps some joint procurement with the Virginia Transportation Museum. Representatives of the C & O Historical Society expressed a desire to develop in the future an excursion train. Lars also mentioned an interest in the past with some of the materials and bricks from the maintenance shop to build new replica buildings at the Heritage Center in the future.

Council members asked a number of questions and indicated while they felt the offer of \$15,000 was acceptable, they wanted to determine what impact this potential sale would have on our plans to demolish the structures at no cost to the Town other than asbestos removal. Mr. Catlin indicated a revised option agreement would be prepared and reiterated the need for Council action before

October 15, 2016. The Town Manager advised that action could be taken at the first meeting in October.

The Town Manager then provided information on the Event Board project, showing sketches of the proposed boards, as well as their location as replacements to the white lattice boards which belong to Main Street. She reported that Main Street is supportive of the project and that they will be contacting organizations displaying their logos on the current signs, explaining our future plans. Funding is not currently available to construct the new boards and will have to be addressed in the future.

Due to time, the Town Manager passed out a copy of a resolution of support for health care that the Virginia Municipal League members were sent for their possible adoption. The Town Manager will place this item on the agenda for the next work session.

**2. ORDINANCE TO ADOPT TOURISM ZONE**

**4. APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION**

Town Council has previously approved the General Fund Capital Improvement Program for fiscal year 2016-2017 budget. In order to purchase these items in a timely manner, we must borrow the funds via a short term loan. This resolution will allow us to go ahead and purchase items from the list prior to securing the financing terms, and then reimburse the general fund from the loan proceeds when the loan is finalized.

Mayor Brinkley asked LeeAnna Tyler, Finance Director to explain the purpose of the resolution. Mrs. Tyler stated that the items listed in Exhibit A of the resolution were

included in the capital improvement portion of the FY 2017/18 budget. She stated that, the General Fund does not have the amount of funds necessary to support all of the items and so it is necessary to do the reimbursement resolution in order to fund the projects and allow for purchase process to begin. She stated that to fund these types of expenditures, the Town borrows the money in order to reimburse the General Fund. She stated that the Town currently has a loan from BB&T that funded projects from the previous fiscal year which will be paid in full in January 2017 and once that loan is closed, she will then proceed with securing the loan for the items listed in this resolution, but that doing this now allows for the purchase process to begin and not have to wait for the loan to be in place.

### **MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

LeeAnna Tyler explained that Mrs. Burcham is unable to attend tonight's meeting due to attending the ICMA Conference and stated that she would like to mention the fire in the downtown area that occurred over the weekend. She stated that the fire was contained to one apartment and that while there wasn't much damage from the fire, there is a lot of water damage and that both Livy's Closet and the Fire and Light Gallery were completely destroyed. She mentioned that Livy's Closet has been able to relocate to another storefront in the area that is being loaned to her and that at this time Chuck Almarez isn't sure what he is going to do for the Fire and Light Gallery, but thankfully he has stated that none of his equipment was damaged, only prints and files for which he has copies. Mrs. Tyler also mentioned that the apartment involved in the fire belonged to one of our Public Works employees who was transported to the hospital for smoke inhalation, but is okay and back to work today. She asked that everyone keep all involved in your thoughts for their loss.

Mayor Brinkley mentioned the upcoming events, and made special notice of the “Con of the Mountain” event and encouraged everyone to attend.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Martha Edwards addressed Council on behalf of the Clifton Forge Library. She mentioned the full page editorial in the Roanoke Times about the Library which mentions the unique tourism initiative that the Town is utilizing with the Con event to be held this weekend. She thanked Council, Library Director, Mike Barnes, Jack Berberette and his entire crew of helpers, and the many volunteers who make it all possible. Mrs. Edwards stated that she moved to Clifton Forge 11 ½ years ago and began working with the Library doing normal activities such as quilt shows. She also mentioned the Friends of the Library and all of their work as well. Mrs. Edwards then mentioned that she feels there is a problem with security at the Library. She stated that there have been a couple of events during the last couple of weeks in which there has only been one member of the staff on duty and she would like to suggest installing some type of panic button or some other form of alarm to help in those cases with people who have exhibited strange behavior. She suggested something similar to the Life Alert necklaces that would allow easy access so the employee can get help easily. She stated that the Library has a large floor plan. She also mentioned there has been a lot of vandalism outside of the Library over the last several years and recently the Little Free Library located near the Amphitheatre was severely damaged causing considerable costs for a private citizen to repair. She stated that it seems this location has been vandalized a lot with books being thrown in the creek and other instances and that the Police Department has said that they would get cameras installed in the area, but to date have not. She asked Council to please address the issue and see if something can't be done for better security.

Karen Swoope mentioned the benefit Poker Run sponsored by TAP being held on October 8, beginning at 8 AM at the Double C Café in Covington. She stated that TAP is a good project and encouraged people to attend to show their support.

## **COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Councilman Irvine thanked everyone for coming and stated that he was glad to see that no one was injured in the fire. He thanked the Library for all that they are doing for the Con event and stated that he hopes 4,000 people attend!

Councilwoman Roberts thanked the Boy Scout members for attending and stated that she hoped it was interesting for them and not too boring and encouraged them all to attend the Con this weekend. She thanked Mrs. Edwards and stated that Council would look into the issue and again mentioned that she is excited for the Con event this weekend. She thanked everyone for coming and wished everyone a good week ahead.

Councilman Umstead thanked everyone for coming and thanked the Boy Scout members for attending. He apologized about the issue with the Little Free Library and stated he wasn't aware it had occurred, but that in a Town that is growing things of this nature are going to occur unfortunately and will just have to be dealt with when they do.

Vice Mayor Hillert asked Mrs. Tyler to introduce the Boy Scout members. Mrs. Tyler explained that the members are from Troop 31 in Covington and are attending the meeting as part of their Citizenship in the Community merit badge which she is teaching. She stated that as a part of their training they are required to attend one meeting and do some other community involvement activities. Mrs. Hillert welcomed them all and stated it is nice to have them attend. Mrs. Hillert mentioned all that were affected by the fire and asked that everyone keep them in thoughts and hearts while they rebound from the damages and loss incurred. She stated that the two businesses involved are both great businesses the Town and she hopes they are back in place and operation soon.

Mayor Brinkley thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and thanked the Boy Scouts for attending. He advised that they are welcome to attend at any time. He mentioned that this Friday will mark the last day for the Downtown Market for the season.

**ORDINANCE TO DELETE  
SECTION 34-71 OF  
THE CODE OF ORDINANCES
