

Pamela Marshall was elected to Clifton Forge Town Council in November 2018. She was born and raised in Clifton Forge but left for employment shortly after graduating from Clifton Forge High School in 1979. She worked for the Federal Bureau of Investigation in Washington, DC for 32 years where she was instrumental in recruiting and hiring over 2,000 Intelligence Analysts after 9/11.
